### A Habit Worth Having

Have you visited the new WRCH website? Jonathan Spiliotopolus, owner of The Creative Offices, has done a fantastic job reviving [www.whiterockcenterofhope.org](http://www.whiterockcenterofhope.org) and included a donation link with a special offer. Just look for the line in green, where you click a box, to make a recurring monthly gift.

By selecting "Monthly Giving," you create 12 times the impact. During the year, \$10 becomes \$120, which feeds two large families for seven days; \$25 becomes \$300 which prevents three households from losing their utilities; \$100, becomes \$1,200 and that will keep three families from becoming homeless. You will increase your blessings manifold.

When you set up a recurring gift of any amount to WRCH, you create a ripple effect that reaches out and touches others. Now, multiply that by 12 and you will get a sense of the enormous impact you can make with recurring gifts.

If you typically give \$100 in a year, please consider visiting [www.whiterockcenterofhope.org](http://www.whiterockcenterofhope.org) and see how easy it is to set up a \$10/month gift, you will increase your annual giving, helping more people!

Because you give, WRCH is able to offer immediate, short-term financial assistance for people experiencing income disruption and high-risk, vulnerable groups. Because of you, people living in zip codes 75218, 75228, 75238, 75214 and 75223 and others affected by Covid-19 who suddenly find themselves unable to provide for their families **receive help and hope**. An average of 65 volunteers a month served more than **21,000 hours** last year, distributing **410,000** pounds of food, and **\$87,200** in financial assistance to over 12,100 individuals in 4,400 households. Following these directions, "that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another," (John 13:44) ... **YOU** made it possible to feed **370 families a month** with nutritious groceries to last the family a full week. **YOU** made it possible for **331 households** to avoid potential homelessness and utility disconnection. This work continues as the needs continue. You make it possible. Thank you for caring and loving your neighbors through this extra challenging time!

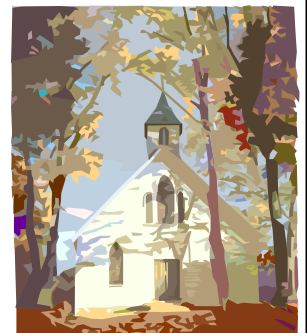
