THANK YOU NORTH TEXAS FOOD BANK

Thanks to a generous \$57,000 grant from the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB), White Rock Center of Hope is thrilled to announce the purchase of a 20-foot refrigerated box truck, enhancing our ability to collect and distribute nutritious food to neighbors in East Dallas.

The demand for Hope's Food Pantry services has continued to rise. In 2024, Hope distributed 69% more pounds of food than in 2023, our prior record-setting year. This new refrigerated truck expands our capacity, reducing food spoilage and improving efficiency, allowing Hope to better serve the growing needs of the community. We are deeply grateful to NTFB for their partnership in the fight against hunger.



Hope was required to match 25% of the total cost. Thanks to 100 Men of Dallas, an anonymous donor, and an anonymous foundation for supporting the match, and to The Creative Offices for designing the artwork that beautifully co-brands the truck.

The need for Hope is growing! Remarkably, in the first quarter of this fiscal year (November, December, and January), more people received assistance from Hope than during the entire year just two years ago, and nearly as

many as received help all year last year.

While we can't predict exactly how economic conditions in East Dallas will evolve in the coming months, one thing is certain: many will continue to need help with their basic needs—food, clothing, and shelter.
